




Year 4 have been investigating how to find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that

produced it, by exploring and creating musical instruments, and explaining how they change pitch.



This week in science, we have been practising our observational drawing skills, paying close attention to the very fine details of violas' shapes, sizes and colours. We annotated our drawings with similes and adventurous adjectives. We're hoping that all of this practice will pay off when we create our own information pages based on The Big Book of Blooms next week!





In Year 1 we have started Computing this half term. This week we learnt how to turn on and login to laptops. We learnt how to use the keypad mouse and had a go at drawing different lines in Paint. We had a go at changing the brush type we were using and the colours. We had a great time!

In Year 1 science we explored the idea of day and night and that the earth is lit up by the sun and it spins on an axis. We looked at how half the earth is in the sun meaning it is lit up and it is day time and at the same time the other half is in darkness and so in night time. We explored how the planet turns around and day will change to night and back to day. We learnt the earth takes one day to spin around.
