This term in Year 1 science we have been learning about materials and their different properties. Last week we talked about lots of different materials and which we thought would make good boats and why. This week we took our boats to the water and tested them out! We used our observation skills to see which material made the best boat and why.





In Year 2 we have also been looking at different materials and their properties. Last week we chose which materials we would like to make our boats from thinking about what we know about each material. This week we tested our boats to see if our prediction about the materials we used was correct. Using our observational skills and knowledge, we wrote why we thought our boat was successful! We also thought about how we could have made it better.

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Wow - what a fantastic morning we had in Years 1, 2 and Foundation! We were so lucky to hear Simon James read two of his brilliant (and our favourite!) books - The Day Jake Vacuumed and Sally and the Limpet. We were also amazed to see him draw two super illustrations to go with the books. We learnt about how to create ideas for stories from our experiences and about the process of writing a book, including writing a 'dummy book' and getting your books published. We really enjoyed meeting Simon and came away inspired to write our own books (some in Year 2 already have started!)



Year4 have had a busy week, on Monday we got messy with the digestive system. We created our own scientific model of the digestive system, following bread through the digestion process.

We thoroughly enjoyed our visit form the author, Simon James on Tuesday, who shared his journey on becoming an author with the children.

In design technology this week, the children designed their own bread and learnt how to shape dough using salt dough, all in preparation for The Great Bread Bake Off after the Easter holidays.









Respect Excellence Friendship
